Sustainable Hand Surgery

Inspired by the 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26), held in Glasgow in November 2021, Elisabet Hagert (on behalf of the Federation of European Societies for Surgery of the Hand) has requested AHSS members complete a short survey regarding the current practice and experiences of hand surgeons in relation to sustainability. To truly evaluate what role sustainability has in our profession, responses are required from a global, not just European, audience. What role do we, surgeons and clinicians, play in affecting our environment? How may we contribute to a more sustainable practice? What are the experiences from hand surgeons in various parts of this world? The AHSS welcomes suggestions about how we, as a group or individually, can reduce the environmental impact of hand surgery in Australia.

The results will be presented at the International Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand (IFSSH) conference in London in 2023 and published in an international hand surgery journal.

MBS Billing Code Revision

The AHSS continues to liaise with the Health Department to amend unworkable descriptors within the framework of the Rapid Review Process.

A meeting was held on 23 December 2021 and attended by representatives of the AHSS, AOA and Department of Health. Representing the Australian Hand Surgery Society was Jeff Ecker. Mark Ross and Mark Baker. Representing the AOA was Dr Annette Holian (President), Adrian Cosenza (CEO), Kathy Hill (Advocacy and Governance Representing the Department of Health was Megan Keaney (Principal Advisor, Medical Benefits Division of the Department of Health and Chair of the meeting), Nigel Murray, Leeann Galloway, Polly Logmans and Rebecca Jacobs.

The meeting was constructive and the Health Department appeared to hear our concerns and agreed with most of the changes recommended. This is in process and the AHSS will continue to update the membership as developments occur.

AHSS Research Grants

Applications are open for AHSS research grants to support clinical or laboratory-based projects that are relevant to the field of hand surgery. It is anticipated that up to three grants will be awarded with a maximum funding of \$7,000 per project.

Applications must list an AHSS member as the Principal Investigator and outline the research hypothesis, objectives, background and methods and how the funds will be used. Please submit applications to education@ahss.org.au no later than 14 February 2022.
